

DEPARTMENT HEAD FOR A PRE-PROFESSIONAL DANCE PROGRAM

The Baltimore School for the Arts (BSA) seeks a dance professional to lead its pre-professional dance training program. The title for this position will be **Dance Department Head.**

The Dance Department Head is the artistic director and educational leader of BSA's dance program and has primary responsibility for envisioning and implementing educational and performance programming in the dance department.

The search committee, made up of members of the BSA Board of Overseers, faculty, alumni, parents and artists, seeks a department head who will ensure that BSA will continue to provide excellent, relevant dance training to its 100 high school dance students and 300 pre-high school students.

THE BALTIMORE SCHOOL FOR THE ARTS

In addition to dance, BSA provides conservatory quality, pre-professional training in theatre, music, stage production, visual arts and film. Students, admitted to the school solely on the basis of an arts audition, study one arts discipline in conjunction with a challenging college preparatory academic curriculum. Students spend a minimum of 3 hours per day in artistic coursework. There are 415 students in grades 9-12, and approximately 100 in the dance program each year.

The school has an exceptional graduation and college placement record – each year 95% or more of its graduates continue on to higher education. BSA is a Baltimore City Public School.

BSA has been recognized as one of the top five public arts high schools in the U.S. In recent surveys, graduates report college graduation rates nearly double the national average. BSA alumni can be found on Broadway and television, in films, in major dance companies, orchestras, and in museums, galleries and design firms all over the world.

As one of Baltimore's premier cultural institutions, the school attracts artists of the highest caliber as faculty, as well as for residencies and master classes. BSA also provides access to the arts to Baltimore's families and children through its free after-school arts education program, TWIGS (To Work In Gaining Skills), which serves 700 students per week, as well as other community outreach programs. The Dance Department Head oversees dance curriculum for TWIGS and all of the outreach efforts that involve the department.

THE POSITION: DANCE DEPARTMENT HEAD (TEACHER-LEVEL POSITION)

SUMMARY

The Baltimore School for the Arts seeks a **Dance Department Head** (**Teacher-level position**) to begin in August 2018.

BSA's Dance Department Head leads a pre-professional dance training program that serves a diverse student body, largely drawn from Baltimore City. BSA's students are selected through an audition for the dance program, and many are new to intensive dance training.

This person will manage the High School dance program and oversee the TWIGS dance program.

The High School program is part of a full school day, with a minimum of 3 hours of dance instruction per day. The training program features frequent visits from professional choreographers and college dance faculty. The Department Head selects and coordinates the work of the guest artists.

The TWIGS program, free to 2nd through 8th grade Baltimore City residents, is an after-school and Saturday program with class time ranging from 1 hour to 3 hours per week. TWIGS dance students are involved in several large-scale dance productions each year.

The dance program offers a rigorous, physically demanding program modeled on real-world expectations for today's young dancers. The program features intensive technical training as well as audition-based performance opportunities. A comprehensive curriculum of classes in traditional ballet and modern technique prepares students for advanced college-level dance programs, as well as for future work with professional dance companies – both modern and ballet – and theatrical, television or film productions.

The Dance Department Head is responsible organizing the program's curriculum, schedule and staff. The training ranges from beginning classes for elementary students to upper-level classes and productions that involve professional orchestras and masterworks of the dance repertoire. Many graduates of the dance program will be qualified for the most selective post-secondary dance training programs. Mentoring students as they progress is central to this role.

- · Alumni dancing or choreographing with Alvin Ailey Dance Theatre, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Ballet British Columbia, LINES Ballet and Hubbard Street
- · Alumni studying at University of Southern California, Juilliard, Southern Methodist University and Butler University

RESPONSIBILITIES

BSA High School

- Inspires young people with compelling and effective dance training
- Oversees approximately 100 students (grades 9-12) in the High School Dance program on a daily basis
 - o Engages in regular communication with students and their parents
- Manages the dance faculty (10 full- and part-time) of practicing, professional artists
- Supervises the performance aspects of the dance program by collaborating with colleagues (ex. theatre, music, production) across the school
 - O In coordination with the school's Director, selects accomplished guest artists and choreographers to work with BSA students and create choreography for the school's performance programs
 - o Recent guest artists include Barry Hughson, Christopher D'Amboise and Jeffrey Gunshol
- Communicates with prospective students and their families about the program in on-campus events and organizes auditions for prospective students

BSA-TWIGS

- Oversees approximately 300 2nd through 8th grade students that come to BSA for free after-school and Saturday dance training programs
- Manages the education program for these young students

Dance Curriculum

• In collaboration with the dance faculty and school Director, develops a progressive curriculum that provides powerful educational opportunities for students and connects them to the professional world of dance

Compensation and Benefits

The BSA Board of Overseers will work closely with the Baltimore City Schools' Office of Human Capital to provide a salary that is within City Schools' guidelines and is commensurate with background and experience. BCPS teacher-level salary ranges from \$48,430 to \$102,832. BCPS also provides excellent health benefits that include vision, dental and prescription drug coverage, State of Maryland teachers' retirement benefits and life insurance.
