

Theatre Department Head Donald Hicken to retire at the end of the school year; BSA launches national search for new Theatre Head

Donald Hicken, at the helm of BSA's theatre department before day one as a member of the planning team when the school was just an idea, will be retiring at the end of this school year. Over the years, he has taught and influenced hundreds of students including Jada Pinkett Smith, Josh Charles, Shalita Grant, and Tupac Shakur. "Donald has shaped BSA to be the unique, powerful and nurturing place that it is today. He's had life-changing impact on all of the students he teaches," said Director Chris Ford in a recent <u>Sun article</u>.

In June 2015, Hicken was one of three finalists of over 4,000 nominees for the first-ever <u>Tony</u> <u>Award for Excellence in Theatre Education</u>, a special honor that recognized K-12 theatre educators in the U.S. who have demonstrated monumental impact on the lives of students and who embody the highest standards of the profession. Recently, BSA welcomed theatre students from the U.K. for the **10th annual BSA exchange program** founded by Hicken. Unique for a public city school, the program enables BSA's actors to work with their counterparts twice, once in Baltimore and then at <u>Showdown Theatre Arts</u> in the spring when a full production is staged. The BSA students, most of whom have never traveled abroad, also have the opportunity to visit London theatres and other sites. This year the group will present "<u>Prospect High: Brooklyn</u>," a nationwide premiere play created by <u>Roundabout Theatre</u>. BSA is one of a select group of high schools chosen to work on the project.



BSA students and their British counterparts will present Prospect High: Brooklyn in the U.K. this May. This is the 10th year of an international exchange program founded by Hicken.
