# BSA Students Bring History Alive and Celebrate the Bicentennial of the Star Spangled Banner

Students are in the midst of this year's historical theatre collaboration with the Maryland Historical Society and National Park Service. The project, called Citizen Stand: The Battle for Baltimore 1814, features three short plays about the Battle of Baltimore. The original plays, researched and written by students and faculty mentors, explore the role of women behind the front lines; Jewish and Quaker citizens reconciling their religious convictions to defend their homeland; and the diverse experience of free and enslaved African Americans during the war. "It's a history trifecta, and that's what you can experience," says Fort



McHenry's Ranger Vince Vaise. The students performed over the weekend at Fort McHenry and there's a final free production on **Friday**, **May 2** at 6 pm at the MDHS followed by a reception.
